Greetings

Windmills was launched to share what is happening around our District. With the shut down because of Covid, with the stopping of events there became nothing to share. Although we are not out of the woods, communicating around the congregations is failing so it is time to I relaunch Windmills. Of course, all things are subject to change because of Covid and government rule changes.

As we begin again a new Year with all the promises that it holds before us it is important that we do not drop into the rhythm of years past. Speaking with Bruce Cook, he reports an ongoing decline of all centres and with the pressure of increasing costs, the viability of all our centres are under threat. We cannot just keep on doing what we have done in the past with the *hope* that things will get better. We need to become **deliberate** about what we are doing and courageous in finding our way forward. Another Ministry Unit in the diocese said they are not interested in planning for the next five years as they will **all be dead or incapacitated.** But what we have was passed to us by our forebears and so it is our responsibility to pass this on to those who come after (Not only property, but the faith itself).

There is the temptation to suggest that this my responsibility as district priest, but the district model hands this to each centre. My role is about overview/oversight, guiding us forward and equipping individuals and teams. In this capacity, I have been trying to frame our planning. It has been my concern in the time here about the amount of friction that exists in the camp. I am not about to point fingers, but rather we should take a long hard look at ourselves (each and every one of us). Identify unresolved problems where forgiveness and grace is lacking. In some cases you might be justified, but continuing to hang onto wrong attitudes to others is not. This prevents us all from becoming the community of faith that will change the world. It is up to you as an individual.

Looking beyond the Horizon

The Bishop Writes...

I wrote about needing to lift our eyes above the horizon in my Christmas message. Both 2020 and 2021 drew our attention to the immediate situation of responding to COVID19. While 2022 will most likely continue to bring changes due to the pandemic, we cannot allow it to be the primary focus.

If we are to gain insight and have foresight, we must lift our heads up and see beyond the horizon. The Merriam Webster online dictionary defines the essential meaning of insight as

1: the ability to understand people and situations in a very clear way2: an understanding of the true nature of something

Foresight is defined as

1: an act or the power of foreseeing: PRESCIENCE

2: provident care: PRUDENCE

3: an act of looking forward *also*: a view forward


The prophet Joel speaks of a time when all will receive the spirit; that time is now. He speaks of sons and daughters, old men and young men, and even male and female slaves receiving the gift of the spirit. Gaining insight, foresight, dreaming dreams, prophesying, and having visions is a consistent theme as God works among the people. God's word is often transmitted through dreams, prophecy and visions.

As we start 2022, let us lift our eyes above the immediate and see beyond the horizon. Let us pray for insight to deeply understand what is, foresight (along with spiritual discernment) to know what God will do and the willingness to align ourselves with God's purpose.

May God's kingdom be made real in our church communities. May we actively reach out and connect with the wider community that they may know the blessing of being part of God's kingdom on earth.
