

A Celebration for Ash Wednesday First Day of Lent

Sentence

Return to the Lord your God, who is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love. (Joel 2 13)

or

When you fast, put oil on your head and wash your face, so that your fasting may be seen not by others but your Father who is in secret. (Matthew 6:17-18)

Opening Prayer or Collect

Gracious God, out of your love and mercy you breathed into dust the breath of life, creating us to serve you and one another:

call forth our penitence and acts of love, and strengthen us to face our mortality, so that we may look with confidence for your salvation; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever **Amen**.

Collect for the Season

Almighty and everlasting God, you hate nothing that you have made, and you forgive the sins of all who are penitent:

create and make in us new and contrite hearts, that we, worthily lamenting our sins, and acknowledging our wretchedness, may obtain of you, the God of all mercy, perfect remission and forgiveness; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen**.

Readings for Ash Wednesday (Year ABC)

Old Testament: Joel 2:1-2, 12-17

A Reading from the Prophet Joel, Chapter 2 beginning at verse 1

Blow the trumpet in Zion; sound the alarm on my holy mountain! Let all the inhabitants of the land tremble, for the day of the LORD is coming, it is near - a day of darkness and gloom, a day of clouds and thick darkness! Like blackness spread

upon the mountains a great and powerful army comes; their like has never been from of old, nor will be again after them in ages to come.

Yet even now, says the LORD, return to me with all your heart, with fasting, with weeping, and with mourning; rend your hearts and not your clothing. Return to the LORD, your God, for he is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love, and relents from punishing.

Who knows whether he will not turn and relent, and leave a blessing behind him, a grain offering and a drink offering for the LORD, your God? Blow the trumpet in Zion; sanctify a fast; call a solemn assembly; gather the people. Sanctify the congregation; assemble the aged; gather the children, even infants at the breast. Let the bridegroom leave his room, and the bride her canopy.

Between the vestibule and the altar let the priests, the ministers of the LORD, weep. Let them say, "Spare your people, O LORD, and do not make your heritage a mockery, a byword among the nations. Why should it be said among the peoples, `Where is their God?'"

Psalm 51 APBA p 274

- 1 Have mercy on me, O God, in your enduring goodness: according to the fullness of your compassion blot out my offences.
- 2 Wash me thoroughly from my wickedness: and cleanse me from my sin.
- 3 For I acknowledge my rebellion: and my sin is ever before me.
- 4 Against you only have I sinned and done what is evil in your eyes: so you will be just in your sentence and blameless in your judging.
- 5 Surely in wickedness I was brought to birth: and in sin my mother conceived me.
- 6 You that desire truth in the inward parts:O teach me wisdom in the secret places of the heart.
- 7 Purge me with hyssop, and I shall be clean: wash me, and I shall be whiter than snow.
- 8 Make me hear of joy and gladness: let the bones which you have broken rejoice.
- 9 Hide your face from my sins: and blot out all my iniquities.
- 10 Create in me a clean heart, O God: and renew a right spirit within me.

- Do not cast me out from your presence: do not take your holy spirit from me.
- 12 O give me the gladness of your help again: and support me with a willing spirit.
- 13 Then will I teach transgressors your ways: and sinners shall turn to you again.
- 14 O Lord God of my salvation, deliver me from bloodshed: and my tongue shall sing of your righteousness.
- 15 O Lord, open my lips: and my mouth shall proclaim your praise.
- 16 You take no pleasure in sacrifice, or I would give it: burnt-offerings you do not want.
- 17 The sacrifice of God is a broken spirit: a broken and contrite heart, O God, you will not despise.

New Testament: 2 Corinthians 5:20-6:10

A reading from the Second letter of Paul to the Corinthians, Chapter 5, Verse 20

So we are ambassadors for Christ, since God is making his appeal through us; we entreat you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God. For our sake he made him to be sin who knew no sin, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God. As we work together with him, we urge you also not to accept the grace of God in vain. For he says, "At an acceptable time I have listened to you, and on a day of salvation I have helped you."

See, now is the acceptable time; see, now is the day of salvation! We are putting no obstacle in anyone's way, so that no fault may be found with our ministry, but as servants of God we have commended ourselves in every way: through great endurance, in afflictions, hardships, calamities, beatings, imprisonments, riots, labors, sleepless nights, hunger; by purity, knowledge, patience, kindness, holiness of spirit, genuine love, truthful speech, and the power of God; with the weapons of righteousness for the right hand and for the left; in honour and dishonour, in ill repute and good repute. We are treated as impostors, and yet are true; as unknown, and yet are well known; as dying, and see— we are alive; as punished, and yet not killed; as sorrowful, yet always rejoicing; as poor, yet making many rich; as having nothing, and yet possessing everything.

Gospel: Matthew 6:1-6, (7-15), 16-21

A Reading from the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Matthew, Chapter 6, beginning at verse 1 Glory to you Lord Jesus Christ

"Beware of practicing your piety before others in order to be seen by them; for then you have no reward from your Father in heaven. "So whenever you give alms, do not sound a trumpet before you, as the hypocrites do in the synagogues and in the streets, so that they may be praised by others. Truly I tell you, they have received their reward. But when you give alms, do not let your left hand know what your right hand is doing, so that your alms may be done in secret; and your Father who sees in secret will reward you. "And whenever you pray, do not be like the hypocrites; for they love to stand and pray in the synagogues and at the street corners, so that they may be seen by others. Truly I tell you, they have received their reward. But whenever you pray, go into your room and shut the door and pray to your Father who is in secret; and your Father who sees in secret will reward you.

"When you are praying, do not heap up empty phrases as the Gentiles do; for they think that they will be heard because of their many words. Do not be like them, for your Father knows what you need before you ask him. "Pray then in this way: Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name. Your kingdom come. Your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our debts, as we also have forgiven our debtors. And do not bring us to the time of trial, but rescue us from the evil one. For if you forgive others their trespasses, your heavenly Father will also forgive you; but if you do not forgive others, neither will your Father forgive your trespasses.

"And whenever you fast, do not look dismal, like the hypocrites, for they disfigure their faces so as to show others that they are fasting. Truly I tell you, they have received their reward. But when you fast, put oil on your head and wash your face, so that your fasting may be seen not by others but by your Father who is in secret; and your Father who sees in secret will reward you. "Do not store up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust consume and where thieves break in and steal; but store up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust consumes and where thieves do not break in and steal. For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also.
