#### Greetings

With Bishop John's retirement, I am reminded that I have retirement in my future as well. My plan is to work about another four years, but there are factors out of my hands in the process. There always will be things we cannot control, but it is important that we don't allow this to paralyse us, especially in terms of planning for our personal future. We may not achieve exactly what we plan, but having a plan moves us forward.

Sunday July 10 at 10:30am Flying Angel Centre - Edithburgh Final message from Our Bishop...

The Old Testament Reading on Sunday, June 26 is from the Second Book of Kings 2:1-2, 6-14; the succession from Elijah to Elisha. It concludes the Elijah cycle, which commences in the First Book of Kings.

In some respects, it speaks of uncertainty — Elisha is not confident that he will inherit a double share of the Spirit that Elijah had until he picks up the mantle and strikes the Jordan and the waters part so that he can pass over on dry land. It speaks of discernment of God's will coming about by steadfastly sticking with the events as they unfold, not passively but actively — by insisting "I will not leave you". We will see... see what emerges. Whether events will turn out as we think God intends them to be, and they do for Elijah.

Jan and I have given ten years to the Diocese of Willochra. The Diocese of Willochra has given us so much over these ten years. We are so grateful to you all for the gift you have provided to us of calling us to minister here among you.

There have been many occasions when the discernment of the right course involved stepping out in faith, not knowing exactly what would emerge. Being flexible as what was predicted didn't turn out to be what occurred – no one can predict with certainty what another human being will do; in fact, the reality is that the unexpected will happen. Discernment requires a willingness for the route to the end goal – God's purpose fulfilled – to change. Discernment requires action and trust that God's hesed, God's steadfast covenantal love, will sustain us until the goal is reached and indeed will sustain us through to eternity.

Jan and I have been blessed by keeping company with you for the last ten years. We will be leaving the Diocese with mixed emotions – sadness at leaving you and excitement at returning to be with family on a daily basis after some eighteen years away from them.

We have now discerned that God is calling us to new things, to what will be. As my Spiritual Director said, "God is now calling you to the vocation of being a husband, father and grandfather".
