#### From the District Priest...

Then I saw a new heaven and a new earth; for the first heaven and the first earth had passed away, and the sea was no more. And I saw the holy city, the new Jerusalem, coming down out of heaven from God, prepared as a bride adorned for her husband. And I heard a loud voice from the throne saying: 'See, the home of God is among mortals. He will dwell with them; they will be his peoples, and God himself will be with them; he will wipe every tear from their eyes. Death will be no more; mourning and crying and pain will be no more, for the first things have passed away.' And the one who was seated on the throne said, 'See, I am making all things new.' (Revelation 21:1-5)

When we said goodbye to Bishop John on July 2 it is the end of an era for our diocese. A change of Bishop is always a point to regroup and then move forward in a new and enthused way. Pray for Robert Cook, Cheryl Bates and myself as part of the committee searching for names to bring to the October Synod. Without giving anything away, we have some impressive people in the mix. Pray to for Martin Bleby who is guiding us through the process.

As we share time with Archdeacon David and prepare for our annual review and await a new Bishop, this is the time for us to prepare ourselves for a new era as well. In as much as the diocese is challenged by diversity and distance, so are we on the Yorke Peninsula. Each of our centres has their own set of challenges. And what will work for Ardrossan will not work at Edithburgh, but the common problems are funding, personnel, and maintenance. While I sympathise with these problems, as your district priest my focus is also on the bits in between. This can be the big picture stuff, like at Hamley Bridge where there are plans for new housing developments – a positive opportunity to move forward. But also, we need to be there to help our small communities with the changes like the downgrading of services and resources.

As always, our focus should be future-focused and our expectation that there will be change. As we wait in expectation, let us also be ready to move with the change that is inevitable. I ask that we work towards finding one new initiative from each part of our district to connect with the communities we serve.
