People – invite friends, Pastoral Visiting to include parishioners, lapsed members, reality of aging congregations, have major fundraisers that every church contributes to or attends.

Fundraising – BBQ at Seafarers' Centre, quiz night, develop an online Op Shop for significant items eg. furniture, household items etc., 5th Sunday offerings to help struggling churches, we need a priest otherwise just have LLMs or home church., have a meal as a fundraiser, curry night, African night, Italian night etc., be recompensed for power and water bills for a year.

Other ideas – Mt. Rat Church members put up a banner advertising next service resulting a young mother and family attending. Use Op Shops to boost funds, need staffing. Use Centre Link People. Use of spare properties, vacant blocks but needs large funds. Use church buildings for functions eg catering, use the empty church buildings for music events, making use of excellent acoustics.

Ven. Andrew Lang explained the position of The Ministry District, can this model be changed?

Need to set up a meeting with Port Vincent members and other volunteers. Invite members of other churches to Pancake Tea.

Over the last nine months, I have been engaged in thinking about our district's future and as part of thinking about the future of the Diocese. It is important to note that compared to most, the district is quite well off, but this does not negate the treasurer's warnings about our own financial position. Perhaps the strongest part of our District is the SYP, whose four centres work together as a cluster. It is not without its issues, but the general sense of this cooperation is mutual support and responsibility sharing in fundraising and mission.

It has got me thinking that this might help the weaker centres to be paired with others to strengthen our management and our resources. I need to open up the discussion about restructuring our district into four units. I want to propose this arrangement of centres:

- A. Ardrossan Maitland Port Victoria (Point Pearce)
- B. Mt Rat, Curramulka, Port Vincent, Stansbury
- C. Minlaton
- D. Corny Point, Warooka, Yorketown, Edithburgh (ie SYP)

We would use the model of SYP as our starting point but could need to modify it to make it work. As a district committee, we need to move away from receiving of reports and start to actively plan for both mission and ministry and work to find our much-needed funds.

I throw this up as an idea for positive discussion in our meeting.
