So wait until rules of the Diocese changes. Diocesan Council may make some money available for mission in the area.

From the District Priest....

Well, we begin with Robert Cook as our new chair and Cheryl Bates as our new Treasurer. I welcome them to these roles and look forward to the way ahead. It may sound like a bit of a repeating scenario, but our current position as always is critical. Deaths and departures have seen a decline in our numbers and only Edithburgh and the Wednesday fellowship have welcomed new people. Although this has implications on the bottom line, it would be wrong to try and see this as a financial crisis. Rather it is in reality a crisis in connection. We are not connecting with the community, especially the younger demographic, but it is not just a matter of opening the church doors on a Sunday morning, and hoping that people will drift in. Rather, we need to meet people where they are, connecting with their needs and aspirations. It would be easy if there were one simple solution, but the reality is that different solutions will be needed in different parts of the district. Edithburgh, Stansbury, Port Vincent and Port Victoria are places where the community grows as people retire, and prior to that holiday. The simple question is what would help us to connect these people? This is the discussion we need to engage in, but we must not leave this to the individual units, but work together.

We do share this dilemma with the other traditional churches on the peninsula and so we should maintain an ongoing dialogue with them. Many ideas are floating around, but besides gathering these, we will need to discern what might work. There is not necessarily only one solution. The chief responsibility of leadership is to tackle this significant problem.

Cost est. \$2,000 tba from Wayne Pring of Wallaroo 2022, or alternatively A &R Bricklayers \$7,480 (as at 31.7.2018) Allan Godwin from Coobowie.

Mission to Seafarers' - Port Giles

Although there were 2 ships in Port Giles in August, the MV Paiwan Wisdom which loaded 10,000 tons of lentils and the MV Lowland Angel which loaded 10,000 tons of lentils and 5,000 tons of Faba beans, no seafarers had shore leave.

The ships were only in port for one day each.

The wharf was closed for maintenance during the latter half of the month and our Lay Chaplain June and Committee member / Volunteer Paul were away attending the MtS National Conference in Melbourne.

Our AGM was held on August 21st and a new committee was elected for the coming year. We look forward to an active, rewarding and interesting time working for seafarers arriving in Port Giles.

We have registered with the Edithburgh Jetty 150 celebrations to be held in October.

Paul has sprayed the grounds and some work has been done to tidy the garden.

Mice have again invaded the FAC and have made a mess of the chips on the shelves. All the chips have now been transferred to storage tubs.

A 'Square' and mobile phone have been purchased to enable credit cards to be used for purchases from our MtS.

In September another two ships arrives. The MV ASL Leban arrived while Paul and I were away at the National Conference. The MV IVS Sparrowhawk made a short stay to collect 10,000 tons of lentils. A bag of beanies and a Care bag were handed over at the gangplank to a happy Filipino. The crew consisted of 6 South Africans and 14 Filipinos.

On September 8th I gave a talk to approximately 100 people from the Wallaroo and Kadina Red Cross groups in the Wallaroo Sports Club. It was very successful with \$130 handed to me afterwards by several participants. Beanies and scarves were also given and two bags of tins for Ray's ANZAC biscuits were subsequently delivered to the FAC. The tins were kindly donated by George Street Moonta Antiques.

Margaret Groves from Portland and Bev Bird from Ballarat stayed in Edithburgh for a week and spent an afternoon at the FAC delivering beanies scarves, bags and clothing. They met some of our committee over afternoon tea. Margaret has been responsible for over 2,000 beanies plus bags and other items.

The National Conference in Melbourne was very successful. Actually being face to face with people once again was wonderful.

We were able to meet representatives from many MtS centres and to share information.

Learning about the global activities, changes and expectations concerning seafarers and our centres was interesting. We have some challenging times ahead.

Training and policy development will be important during the next 12 months. Risk Management is an area to be highlighted. The IHASCO training modules are available to us free of charge.

The Admiralty Marshall gave a disturbing talk on abandonment of ships in Australia and abroad.

Mrs Tomi Toluhi the Chief Operating Officer from IHQ on being open to change, being inclusive and being united as a global family. She stressed the need for Risk Management but to balance it with productivity and that safety must be done as a team.

A session on Optus telecommunication services now and coming was interesting.

We were privileged to take part in a moving Merchant Navy Memorial Service at the Shrine of Remembrance.

Sung Evensong was also held for Merchant Navy Day in the Melbourne MtS Memorial Chapel of St Peter the Mariner. Fellowship in the centre followed.

We spent some hours learning about mental health issues and suicide prevention. Paul and I are now trained in 'safe TALK'.

The networking and sharing during the conference was very valuable.
